Key preliminary findings from the research:

- Top 4 racist incidents reported by Asian Canadian respondents are: being blamed for spreading Covid 19 (68%), unfair treatment at work or by people of authority (64%), denial of services (63%), and verbal abuse (50%).
- Top 4 reported impacts of racist incidents are: reexperiencing (85%), avoidance (79%), adverse changes in cognition and mood (71%), and distress and interference (70%).
- Victims of racist incidents are more than twice likely to rely on support from family and friends than to access formal services in dealing with the impact of racism.
- The majority of frontline and community workers surveyed (25 out of 46 or 54%) have not received training or professional development in the past five years on antiracism.
- There is lack of culturally appropriate mental health services available to Asians who experience racial trauma, and lack of mental health services in other languages than English.

The training program:

- A 15-hour training program for settlement and community workers.
- Outcome: Participants will gain in-depth knowledge about anti-Asian racism and its impact on Asian Canadians' wellbeing. They will develop practical skills to support victims of racism.
- A hybrid online delivery format: 11 hours of self-paced learning and 4 hours of facilitated discussion and reflection.
- The 4-week pilot training will take place May 15 June 9, 2023 for the first cohort and July 10 - August 4, 2023 for the second cohort.
