Purpose of the Research:

- The purpose of this study is to examine how East and Southeast Asian Canadian
 histories, experiences and contributions are reflected in the Ontario curriculum for
 Grades 7-12. It also seeks to understand educators' perspectives and concerns, identify
 barriers to implementing an inclusive curriculum, and to explore the needed resources
 and support for curriculum development and delivery that promote equity, diversity,
 and inclusion.
- This study comprises two phases. This Phase, which is Phase I, consists of a survey of up to 1000 Grades 7-12 public school teachers, school administrators, and school board senior staff in Ontario. Phase II will consist of semi-structured interviews with 50 of these educators to further understand their experiences, insights and suggestions related to the inclusion of East and Southeast Asian Canadian experiences in Ontario education. This letter of information is to invite participants to engage in Phase I of the study.

Procedures:

• It will take you about 10 minutes to complete this survey. The survey will ask both multiple choice questions and short answer questions about your thoughts, and a short section about demographic information.

Potential Risks:

• There is no anticipated risk for participating in this study.

• There is no direct benefit to you from participating in this study. We hope this research will provide important empirical data in support of an inclusive curriculum and school culture, which will benefit the community and beyond.

- The survey data will be collected using SurveyMonkey's <u>Anonymous Responses</u> <u>collector option</u>. Your answers will be securely stored in SurveyMonkey's SOC 2 accredited data centers that adhere to security and technical best practices.
